
Why is the eye so vulnerable?

- · Aiming weapons





Eye exceptionally vulnerable to small fragments








Why is the eye so vulnerable?

Incidence of eye injuries is 20-50x higher than expected by surface area alone







Civil War

Eye involved reportedly less than 1% of casualties












Civil War

Eye included in concomitant wounds









Reported at Richmond's Chimborazo Hospital: "62% of eye-wounded reported back to unit"

While a significant percentage of state


disability pensions, this was for
